

We will support you to get to know the other members of the Board.




We will provide all the training you need to make sure you are comfortable and confident with:

You will get regular supervision and people will be available for advice and guidance.



# Roles and responsibilities

What you will be doing and what we expect from you.



### You will:



 Go to meetings where possible and give your apologies before the meeting if you are unable to attend.



 Support and run the Experts by Experience virtual (meeting using video calls) groups.



 Understand and share the views of Experts by Experience from what they have said in their forums.



 Prepare for meetings. For example, reading the agenda and the meeting minutes.



Ask questions and bring ideas to meetings.



 Challenge what is said in meetings but be respectful.



Feedback information from meetings of the Experts by Experience virtual groups and the Experts by Experience engagement events.



 Check emails, texts or phone for messages before meetings to pick up information or check if meetings are cancelled.



Listen to what is being said and not be distracted when you are in meetings.



Be on time for meetings or calls



 Present a good appearance by thinking about personal hygiene, appropriate clothing, respectful language and behaviour.



 Know your own limits, ask for help when you need it.
