Grants to Improve Maternity Outcomes

With funding from the Tampon Tax Fund, Safer Beginnings is a collaborative programme with delivery partners from across the maternity and early years sectors.

Charities, Community Interest Companies, not-for-profit groups and grassroots movements may apply.

All proposed programmes must include the use of Baby Buddy 2.0, an app launched in November 2021 to enable more women and girls to access personalised information and resources and promote selfagency in their maternity and early years journeys.

Grants can cover programme costs and organisational core costs as long as they are necessary to the delivery of the proposed activities.

The deadline to apply is 24th March, 2022 (10am).

Impetus Seeking Charity Partners for Youth Employment and Equity Projects

Registered charities and social enterprises can now apply for unrestricted, core funding to help them deliver programmes that support disadvantaged young people into employment, education or training.

This funding round will provide four grants, which can range from £30,000 to £100,000 per year for two years.

Impetus is particularly interested in organisations working outside of London (specifically Yorkshire and the Humber, West Midlands and North West) and those working with Bangladeshi, Pakistani, Black and Gypsy/Roma Traveller young people.

The deadline to apply is 27th March, 2022 (midnight).

Charities Have Until the End of March to Apply for Arts Society Spring Grant Round

The Arts Society is offering grants of up to £3,000 for UK-registered charities to deliver projects and activities that engage young people with the arts, support skills development and training in the arts and heritage sector and support local and regional art organisations and museums.

Funding is for projects that fall under one or more of the following priorities:

- Young Arts Projects that support a wide range of activities to introduce young people to and engage them in artistic experience and practise
- **Skills Development** Projects that further the development and training of skills in the arts, crafts, and heritage.
- Regional Museums, Galleries, and Arts Organisations –
 Projects that support regional and local museums (Regional
 and local theatres and performing arts spaces will also be
 considered).

The deadline for applications is 31st March, (23:59).

UK Government Offering Grants to Support Homelessness Services

The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) has announced an £8 million fund over the next three years to support the work of the voluntary and community sector in tackling homelessness and rough sleeping.

The Programme is divided into four individually biddable lots, each with a different objective and its own individual budget per annum:

- Lot 1 Increase the capacity and capability of the sector to prevent and relieve rough sleeping and homelessness.
- Lot 2 Deliver a specific, specialist advice service to help frontline workers resolve individual cases.
- Lot 3 Enable stronger local strategic partnerships.
- Lot 4 Developing the faith and community sector.

Applications are accepted from voluntary and community sector organisations consortium bids are also encouraged.

The deadline to apply is 1st April, 2022.

New Grants to Tackle Climate Justice

As part of its Food for the Planet project, registered charity Sustain is delivering small grants to support communities to campaign and advocate for food and climate justice in their local areas.

Grants of up to £5,000 are available to Sustainable Food Partnerships, local authorities and community or campaign groups.

Eligible activities may include:

- Encouraging and celebrating climate-friendly food in public institutions and council settings.
- Growing more sustainable and healthy food, especially in urban fringes.
- Tackling unfair and unhelpful pricing and advertising of the most climate-damaging foods.
- Divesting from industrial agriculture.

There will be an introductory workshop on 14th March 2022 from 11am to 12pm for potential applicants who would like to discuss their projects in more detail.

The deadline to apply is 15th April, 2022.
