

HAVE YOUR SAY ON THE FUTURE OF OUR HEALTHCARE SERVICES

Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) has launched a second phase of public engagement for Tomorrow's NUH (TNUH) – a once-in-a-generation opportunity to transform the hospitals run by Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust (NUH). TNUH is part of the Government's New Hospital Programme, which is investing in buildings and equipment across the NHS, to ensure patients and staff have the facilities they need for the future. When we last talked to the public in November and December 2020, the CCG shared a series of high-level proposals. Most people during this initial phase of engagement, were supportive of the ideas that were being discussed, but wanted to know more about how they would work together. Since then, a lot of work has been undertaken to develop the proposals and identify what could be done, to make the best use of the funding that would be available from the Government.

We're now at a key stage in the process, and the CCG need our input to help shape the way our healthcare is delivered in the future.
