Time to Reflect

We serve a loving and faithful God. Nothing is impossible for God. No matter what we face we can face it in full confidence that he is with us even when it feels like he is not. We are reminded of this in both our readings today. In the Psalm we are reminded that he

protects and takes care of us. It can at times feel like God is not there, that he isn't listening to us or that he has abandoned us. But he hasn't and he never will even though it can feel like he has.

The reading from the Gospel of Luke is a challenging one. Challenging because it reminds us of the importance of helping those who need our help. By helping those who need our help not only are we making a difference to their lives, but we are sharing something of the love of God with them too. By sharing the love of God with others we are showing them that there is a God who loves and cares for them and wants to help them through us. In our reading from Luke we see how the rich man does not help Lazarus when he is able to. He doesn't show him the love and care that God has for him. We know that our God is a loving, caring, faithful God and he wants others to know that too. He calls each of us to share that love with others that they may come to know him and his love for them. He calls us to help others so that they may learn of the faithful God whom we trust and serve. At this time in which the country is going through a cost of living crisis it is more important than ever that we share the love of God with others. You may be thinking how can I help others? Just one small act of kindness to another person can make a big difference in their life. And that small act can set off a chain of events that results in them knowing and understanding the love that God has for each and every one of us.

God wants us all to know of his love for us. And he is always with us and will never leave us. So as we are reminded of God's love and faithfulness to us let us share that with others in any way that we can.

¹⁹ 'There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and
fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every
day. ²⁰And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus,
covered with sores, ²¹who longed to satisfy his hunger
with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs
would come and lick his sores. ²²The poor man died and
was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The
rich man also died and was buried. ²³In Hades, where he
was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham
far away with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴He called out,
"Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus
to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue;
for I am in agony in these flames." ²⁵But Abraham said,
"Child, remember that during your lifetime you received
your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things;
but now he is comforted here, and you are in
agony. ²⁶Besides all this, between you and us a great
chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to
pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can
cross from there to us." ²⁷He said, "Then, father, I beg
you to send him to my father's house— ²⁸for I have five
brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not
also come into this place of torment." ²⁹Abraham
replied, "They have Moses and the prophets; they
should listen to them." ³⁰He said, "No, father Abraham;
but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will
repent." ³¹He said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses
and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if
someone rises from the dead." '
