The Stewardship Group includes a range of professionals, organisations and frontline teams working together to make the best use of our health and care resources. The stewardship group will focus on:

- Deploying evidence-based practice
- Prioritising health and care resources based on understanding of value
- Identifying inequalities and targeting vulnerable populations
- Prioritising interventions

The NHS Triple Aim states what we are required to do as an NHS organisation to deliver the best for our resources.

The Health and Care Bill includes a legal duty for decision-makers across NHS bodies (Foundation Trusts, NHS Trusts, Integrated Care Boards and NHS England) to collectively consider the impact of their decisions on:

- Increasing the health and wellbeing of the population they serve (including inequalities in that health and wellbeing)
- The quality of healthcare services for all the population they serve (including inequalities in the benefits from those services) and
- Sustainable and efficient use of NHS resources.

The Stewardship Group will:

- Close the gaps for our patients and service users.
- Empower frontline staff from all organisations to be at the heart of service planning.
- Enable our System to deliver on the promise of Integrated Care.

As part of the Stewardship group volunteers should be happy and willing to give their opinions, advice and share their knowledge and expertise with regard to transformation and improvement of the Derbyshire wide Cardiac service and will play an instrumental part in the decision-making process, attend virtual and face to face meetings and workshops and will be an integral part of the stakeholder group.

Key requirements of the role:

- You should have lived; related experience or knowledge of the issues being discussed around Heart Failure care pathways
- To be passionate about helping to develop and shape Heart Failure Services across Derby and Derbyshire
- To articulate patient and public views from a broad range of perspectives, sometimes beyond your personal experience
- To be committed to addressing health inequalities
- To have an understanding of, and commitment to maintaining confidentiality

 To feel confident communicating effectively with a wide range of people, to voice opinions, and contribute to the debate

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- To be open to, and respectful of other people's points of view
- To be willing to undertake personal development and training where appropriate to support understanding of the meeting content and your contribution to discussions.

Where do meetings take place?	Bi-weekly meetings are through Microsoft Teams and the workshop will be face to face.
