MT (16: 13-20)



Collect for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

O God, who cause the minds of the faithful
to unite in a single purpose,
grant your people to love what you command
and to desire what you promise,
that, amid the uncertainties of this world,
our hearts may be fixed on that place
where true gladness is found.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever.

Background on the Gospel Reading

It is important to read today's Gospel and next week's Gospel as two parts of a single story. These readings are a turning point in Matthew's Gospel. This week we hear Jesus name Simon Peter as the rock upon which he will build his Church. Next week we will hear Jesus call this same Simon Peter "Satan" when he reacts negatively to Jesus' prediction about his passion and death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about his identity. The disciples indicate that most people believe that Jesus is a prophet of Israel. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they believe that he is. Simon Peter answers, identifying Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter will play an important role in the early Christian community as a spokesperson and a leader.

In today's Gospel, Peter's recognition of Jesus' identity is credited to a revelation by God. This will contrast sharply with Jesus' rebuke of Peter in next week's Gospel. When Peter rejects Jesus' prediction of his passion and death, Peter is said to no longer be thinking as God does but as humans do.

The use of the term *church* in today's Gospel is one of only three such occurrences in Matthew's Gospel. Peter in this Gospel is being credited as the foundation for the Church, a privilege granted to him because of his recognition of Jesus' identity. The Church continues to be grounded in the faith that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Bassetlaw Food Hub

St Paul's Food Hub is not part of the Food Bank and is open to all the community. The food available each week has either been donated to the local community hubs by local supermarkets or purchased from FareShare. We have no idea from one week to the next what foods will be available and it is always a great surprise!

The purpose of community food hubs is to cut down on the amount of food wasted, which ends up in landfill, and to redistribute that food at an affordable price

The St Paul's food hub team are keen to make the hub an inviting and informative experience. We are personally inviting those who come to arrive earlier and sit and chat with us and other members of the community while enjoying a cuppa and biscuit. A children's corner is also set up.

Please pass this information on to anyone who you think might be interested and would benefit from the affordable food.

We welcome people from 1pm when tea etc will be available with the sale of food beginning at 2pm

£3.50 per plastic carrier bag and £5 for larger supermarket bags when food stocks allow.





Bassetlaw Food Hub

The St Paul's Community Food Hub opens to all every Tuesday, starting with a cuppa and a chat from 1pm.

Reusable nylon bags will be replacing plastic bags from Tuesday 29 August and can be filled at a cost of £3.50 from the available food. We ask that you bring your bag with you whenever you attend the hub. Food distribution starts when the available food has been laid out in the designated room. Numbered tickets are given on arrival and access to the hub is in numerical order to ensure fairness.

Please remember that all children attending the hub should be accompanied by an adult. Children should not be sent in advance in order to collect a ticket.

New Designated Food Hub Room

We are thrilled to report that our new designated Food Hub room is now up and running. As the Food Hub room is considerably smaller than the hall, a ticketing system is used which results in a fairer situation than previously operated. Three people



go into the Food Hub Room at a time. Feedback from our users tells us that this works well.

This new set up also means that the folk who operate the Food Hub do not have to set up and take down tables before and after each session.

As a result of the new system we may be able to offer extended Food Hub opening hours. This is due to the fact that it will no longer be essential that we start at 2pm to ensure fairness. Food distribution could begin as soon as all the food has been received from Fareshare and Rhubarb Farm and we have set it out ready. The first person to arrive will receive the number one ticket and so on. Feedback from hub users has been really positive.

This week sees the last of the sandwich lunches that we have been operating during the school summer break. We hope to offer the next one during October half-term,

There will also be a second £1 children and young people's hub this week at a cost of £1 per bag. Please ensure that children are accompanied by an adult. This will open at 2pm.
