The session will provide an introduction to grant funding and will look to cover a range of topics to help you better understand what funders and Grantmakers are looking for, and how you can develop strong proposals. We will look at researching and finding out about different funders, as well as considering other income streams for your organisation.

The Training will be delivered by James Kirkpatrick from <u>Funding Support</u> who has over 25 years' experience in grant making and applying for grants. He currently assesses grant applications for Comic Relief and Armed Forces Covenant Trust Fund and has previously worked for the National Lottery Community Fund, BBC Children in Need and Boots Charitable Trust. James has also worked with a wide range of charities and community groups across the East Midlands helping them to develop funding strategies and plans, and to secure funding. Quality Endorsement Framework

Quality Endorsement Framework is a set of Standards that are used to benchmark and demonstrate the quality of organisations working with young people in Nottingham City and County. All people working in this space should strive to offer the best quality experience and outcomes possible for young people, families and communities.

There are 4 strands to be fully fledged:

- Sign up to the youth charter.
- Training Academy (Youth work training)
- Complete a skill audit.
- QEF

You can do 1 part or all of them, there is no set order. once completed you will receive a certificate from the VRP with 1 – 5 stars depending on how much you have completed, you don't need to be funded by the VRP to take part.

Tell us your wraparound childcare needs.

You may be aware that the Government is aiming to ensure that all local authorities and school communities have sufficient wraparound childcare options for families from September 2024 onwards.

Wraparound childcare for primary aged children (up to 11 years old) is defined as care wrapped around a school day and available from at least 8am until 6pm and is childcare that parents pay for.

Nottinghamshire County Council wants to gather the views of parents to see how they currently use

wraparound childcare, and how they may use wraparound childcare in the future. We expect the survey to take about five minutes to complete.

We are asking all families to complete the short survey; your feedback will help us to review current levels of wraparound childcare and take steps to increase the number of places available should we need to. Youth crime rates in Nottinghamshire continue to stay below the national average.

Figures published in the Nottinghamshire Youth Justice Strategic Plan 2024/25 show that the number of first-time offenders, aged 10 to 17, reduced to 130 per 100,000 of the population in the last financial year compared with 144 in 2022/23.

The aim of the Youth Justice Service (YJS) is to focus on reducing the number of children offending, reducing the frequency and rate of reoffending, and to keep children's experience of custody to a minimum.

Cllr Tracey Taylor, Cabinet Member for Children and Families, said: "This is really encouraging news and the good outcomes build on the dedication and hard work of the teams who are involved in diverting young people away from the criminal justice system.

However, as I have said previously, while I welcome the figures, it is important to remember that this is not about numbers but making a difference to people's lives." Check out the link in the comment section to read more about the Youth Justice Service (YJS) and it's key priorities for 2024/25.
