Fundraising – Digital Learning Grant

Almost 7 out of 10 charities are struggling to progress digitally*. If you are one of them, then you can apply for a fully-funded Digital Learning Grant to improve your digital fundraising skills.

Previous participants experienced an increase in:

- small charity digital tactics by 104%
- digital fundraising strategy skills by 90.7%
- email marketing skills by 44.4%
- online accessibility knowledge by 46.7%
- online wellbeing by 51.1%
- social media skills by 35.6%
- digital leadership skills by 35%

JustGiving will be supporting 200 fundraisers to learn, network, and to get 1:1 support to boost their digital fundraising skills and confidence.

Apply before **5pm UK time on October 15th 2024.**

They'll be in touch by November 15th to let you know the outcome.

Core Cost Funding

- The Core Costs funding stream has no application deadline – you can apply at any time
- We will not fund any work that has already taken place, or any costs incurred, before the date we give you a decision
- The first step in applying for Core Costs is to fill in a short Expression of Interest (EOI) form online
- Use the EOI form to tell us a bit more about your organisation, and the work you want us to fund
- You'll be able to access the EOI form in your online account when the funding stream is open
- If we would like to support the work outlined in your EOI form, we'll send you a full application form to complete
- Our National and Regional Plans will help you understand how we prioritise decisions

We receive three times more 'Expression of Interest' requests than we are able to invite to submit a full application. Of those invited to submit a full application 1 in 2 get funding.

BBC Children in Need commits to fairness and making a positive difference for children and young people. It is our responsibility to embrace a diverse, equitable, and inclusive approach to everything we do. Children and young people are great at this and we need to be too.

We encourage you to contact us with any feedback about our grant-making. We want to be as accessible and supportive as possible for your organisation. What are Core Costs?

Core Costs support essential organisational and administrative spending. These are the key expenses required to keep your organisation running.

Our Core Costs funding can be spent on your organisation's central day-to-day operations. These might include, for example:

- Management and administration
- HR and payroll
- General office expenses
- Accountancy and audit
- Communications and outreach
- Monitoring, evaluation, and learning
- Governance, regulatory, and compliance costs

Our Core Costs Funding Stream is for charities and not-for-profit organisations. Applicants to this programme can apply for grants for up to three years. We aim to give quicker decisions for grants of £15,000 or less per year.
