


Progress Pride Flag



The pride flag is a symbol of LGBT+ communities. Originally created in 1978 the pride flag has been redesigned over the years to better represent and


celebrate diversity and inclusion for everyone within LGBT+ communities.



ANNIE KENNEY




Annie Kenney (1879-1953) was a working-class British suffragette known for her activism with the Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU), she was imprisoned 13 times for her protests, becoming an emblem of the struggle for women's right to vote in the UK.




OCTAVIA HILL



One of the three founders of the National Trust, Octavia Hill (1838-1912) was a pioneering thinker and social reformer. She worked tirelessly to improve urban housing and to protect green spaces and the impact of her life and work is still being felt.



Olaudah Equiano (1745-1797)
wrote what is considered the first
slave narrative, giving us a a
window into the life of a slave and
freedman in the mid-eighteenth
century, and into life in Africa at
that time. After buying his
freedom for £40 in 1766, he
became a businessman, explorer,
writer, and campaigned for the
abolition of the slave trade.


IVOR CUMMINGS



Ivor Cummings (1913-1992)
was an openly gay senior
official in the welfare
department of the Colonial
Office, whose job was to
accommodate and welcome
those who arrived from the
colonies, including those
aboard the Empire Windrush.



Charlie Kiss (1965-2022) was a campaigner, trade unionist and the first Trans man to run to be a member of parliament. He joined an anti-nuclear protest camp aged just 17, and played an important role in many other campaigns, serving two jail sentences in the 1980s for his activism.


